Overview

In 1994, the Virginia State Council of the Knights of Columbus incorporated the charity committee to form the Virginia Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc. (VKCCI) for the purpose of carrying out the first principle of our Order, "Charity." VKCCI helps residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia who, through no fault of their own, are unable to provide for the basic essentials of life for themselves or their family members and have exhausted all other avenues of relief. VKCCI currently provides grants of up to \$4,000 to individuals in need. Utilizing funds provided by a KOVAR grant, VKCCI is able to provide funds to individuals with intellectual disabilities.

VKCCI provides grants to individuals and families who are in financial distress. These grants provide for some of the necessities of life for these individuals. Donations from you enable us to continue to give that financial assistance to those who have no other place to turn. From July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022, through your generosity, VKCCI awarded 23 grants for \$78,031.26. Since July 1, 1994 to June 30, 2022, VKCCI has awarded 1,1669 grants totaling \$2,118,669.22.

Recent grant examples: We helped seven COVID victims with their housing expenses: rent, mortgage, and utilities. We helped six families with funeral and burial expenses. We helped three families with physically or intellectually disabled individuals with their special transportation needs (hydraulic lifts, wheelchair ramps, etc.). We helped a widow replace her HVAC system. We helped install a walk-in shower and tub for an elderly man with dementia. We helped a widow with four young children with emergency bills following the unexpected death of her husband. We helped a widow with a number of urgent repairs to her house, including a leaking roof and rotting window frames.

Name of the individual or family.

Names and ages of children, if applicable.

How the Council learned of the situation.

The circumstances that put the individual or family in financial distress.

What is the financial condition of the individual or family? (Submit a detailed breakdown of monthly income and expenses, including amounts and sources. Also include amounts of outstanding debts to further demonstrate need.)

The amount of financial assistance requested from VKCCI.

Council efforts to provide assistance.

Other agencies or organizations contacted for assistance, and their response.
