### Virginia Knights of Columbus Label Program

Name of the individual or family.

Names and ages of children, if applicable.

How the Council learned of the situation.

The circumstances that put the individual or family in financial distress.

What is the financial condition of the individual or family? (Submit a detailed breakdown of monthly income and expenses, including amounts and sources. Also include amounts of outstanding debts to further demonstrate need.)

The amount of financial assistance requested from VKCCI.

Council efforts to provide assistance.

Other agencies or organizations contacted for assistance, and their response.

## Assisting People In Need

### **Overview**

In 1994, the Virginia State Council of the Knights of Columbus incorporated the charity committee to form the Virginia Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc. (VKCCI) for the purpose of carrying out the first principle of our Order, "Charity." VKCCI helps residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia who, through no fault of their own, are unable to provide for the basic essentials of life for themselves or their family members and have exhausted all other avenues of relief. VKCCI currently provides grants of up to \$4,000 to individuals in need. Utilizing funds provided by a KOVAR grant, VKCCI is able to provide funds to individuals with intellectual disabilities.

VKCCI provides grants to individuals and families who are in financial distress. These grants provide for some of the necessities of life for these individuals. Donations from you enable us to continue to give that financial assistance to those who have no other place to turn. Since July 1, 1994 to June 30, 2024, through your generosity, VKCCI has awarded 1,250 grants totaling \$2,389,500. This past year, we awarded 40 grants for a total of \$127,267, the third highest on record.

**Recent grant examples:** We helped a widow with two young children after the suicide death of her husband and father of her children by making mortgage payments. We helped a single mother with a young son who rescued two nieces from an abusive home; we purchased bedroom furniture and clothes for the nieces. We helped a single mother with MS and her two children with urgent house repairs as her salary as the church secretary was insufficient. We assisted a Brother Knight with diabetes who had a leg amputated with critical deck and stairs repair. We assisted an elderly lady in hospice care with overdue rent and utilities. We assisted the family of a Brother Knight who passed away without life insurance or financial resources with funeral and burial expenses. We helped a disabled elderly lady whose mobile home had a leaky roof; we paid for the roof repair. We helped with six funeral and burial expenses.
